Detention:

- Indefinite detention

Labor violations:

- Non-payment of wages
- Hazardous working conditions/ use of hazardous materials without protection
- Climate of fear fostered at workplace through threats of calling ICE/ La Migra

Local law enforcement cooperation with ICE:

- Racial profiling/harassment
- Checkpoints
- Arrest without warrant

Hate crime: *The violence of intolerance and bigotry, intended to hurt and intimidate someone because of their race, ethnicity, color, gender, national origin, religious, sexual orientation, or disability.*

- Verbal targeting/ harassment in public spaces (school, stores, places of worship, workplace, parks, street, mall, etc.)
- Physical assault/harassment in public spaces

Civil Rights:

- Search w/o warrant
- Denial of access to public services (health care, schools, libraries, churches, restaurants, etc.)
- Denial of access to translator in language of origin
- Racial profiling and discrimination
